The latest temporary exhibition about Brigg's postal History is due to close at the end of March and the next exhibition will feature Sporting History – targeting four main sports which are associated with the "Rec" (for

those not in the know, that is Brigg Recreation Ground). The Sports are Tennis, Cricket, Football and Hockey. We know Brigg Town Football Club is one of the oldest in the country still in existence. If you have any artefacts, photos or memories relating to these sports in Brigg that you would care to lend us, can you please get in touch. We're not looking for items to be donated to us, they will be purely on a loan basis and returned to you after the display. We do like to copy the photographs rather than use your originals – so they will be returned as soon as they have been copied.

What else is happening? – the children's craft sessions are still proving to be very popular on Farmers' Market Days, details of these are usually displayed on facebook and advertised in the press. We are developing educational sessions tailored to the needs of the local schools and our bid for help from the Tesco vouchers will make sure we are able to purchase appropriate items for this. One school has already taken part in the Bronze Age sessions and we have had very favourable feedback. We are preparing to host some adult workshops teaching very basic crafts – a start date in April is anticipated.

As this year is the Centenary of the end of World War I we shall again be looking at a project with Sir John Nelthorpe School later in the year. This will be a follow on from the work done by the school in 2014. The WW1 casualties named on the Brigg Memorial will be remembered again. The Commonwealth War Graves (cwgc) Commemoration Certificates are now held at the Heritage Centre for each of those WWI casualties which the Nelthorpe students were able to trace.

The Buttercross Regency Room is a great place to hold meetings talks, small functions and it is licensed for weddings. For detail of hire charges you need to contact the Heritage Centre. You can arrange to have a look before making any decisions.

If you have an interest in any aspect mentioned and would like to help, we are always happy to speak to you about volunteering opportunities.

Book Club Minutes provided by Heather McSharry - 1 February 2018

Books discussed: The Cleaner of Chartres by Salley Vickers

This moving narrative centres on the life of Agnès Morel which we are gradually acquainted with by moving back and forth between her present and past. After a traumatic start to life, Agnès has settled in Chartres, having been initially attracted to the town by a picture of the famous labyrinth within its Cathedral, and made a life for herself by making herself useful to others, which she does with great care and attention, but her quiet and contented life is put at risk by some chance meetings and malicious gossip. Of those who had read the book, almost everyone this time, most found it a very good read. It was commented that it held one's attention to the end, was well written, contained good characterisation, had an air of mystery and that the plot was complex enough to make it interesting without making it difficult to read or enjoy. Everybody liked Agnès as a main character and wanted good things to happen for her. One reader said that everyone she touched benefited in some way. This led to a discussion on being social-minded and making the effort to smile at people and converse in one's day to day life, particularly as you don't know how much of a difference that small act may make to the person at the receiving end. One reader felt that the book credits the reader with intelligence as it leaves you to make certain inferences for yourself without everything being spelled out in black and white. Another said that the character of the book mirrors that of Agnès in that it is quiet and understated. The influence of the nuns Agnès was brought up by led to a comparison with 'Philomena' from those who had read/watched it. Some members have been looking up Chartres' Cathedral and its labyrinth online and one was kind enough to show us some pictures during the meeting. Scores ranged from 6 to 10, mostly 8-9.

The Keeper of Lost Things by Ruth Hogan

This heart-warming tale of a man who amasses a collection of lost items in the hope of reuniting them with their owners, and who passes this responsibility onto his house-keeper – very much for her own good – in his will, was well received by all members that had read it although with mixed enthusiasm as it scored mainly 8s and 9s but also included a 7. It was felt to be a good choice for a Christmas read and someone described it as quite quirky. In some cases mixed enthusiasm was experienced during reading with one member initially finding it a delightful read and later tiring of it and another describing it as 'absolute rubbish' at the outset and then becoming completely hooked. It was commented that the characters were two-dimensional, and one member felt that the character with Down's Syndrome was caricatured to an almost insulting level.







We recommend that you write on your property eg TV's, laptops and tablets to ensure it is traceable to you if it is ever stolen or lost. We suggest writing your postcode and house number on the back of your property. This is so it can be traced back to your property.

February 2018 Article

The resurrection of Jesus is the most important event in the whole history of the universe, not just because to celebrate it we have a day where you're allowed to eat chocolate at every meal and every snack in between! Jesus' death is the centre of the Christian faith but it's his resurrection that gives his death meaning.

Paul wrote that the most important belief is 'Christ died for our sins, according to the scriptures. He was buried and he was raised on the third day according to scriptures and that he appeared to Peter and then to the twelve.' (Corinthians 15:3-5). Later in the same chapter he writes 'if Christ has not been raised, your faith is futile; you are still in your sins' (verse 17). Our sins can be forgiven because Jesus died in our place but it is his resurrection that guarantees that his sacrifice worked.

Jesus predicted that he would die and be raised to life again (Mark 8:31) so his resurrection proves that his teaching is trustworthy and true. Therefore, when he says that he gives his life 'as a ransom for many' (Mark 10:45) we know that is true too. Anyone could say that they will give their life as a ransom for many but the resurrection is proof that Jesus actually did it. Without the resurrection, Jesus could be seen as just a wise teacher of guru, or even a tragic hero who died because he challenged the establishment. With the resurrection we can be sure that Jesus' death was the sacrifice needed to take the punishment we deserve for our sins. We also know that sin has been dealt with because the consequence of sin is death. (Romans 6:23) Jesus' resurrection proves that he has conquered death and therefore also conquered sin.

But the resurrection is more than a proof so that we know we can be forgiven. Paul tells 'we were therefore buried with [Jesus] through baptism into death in order that, just as Christ was raised from the dead through the glory of the Father, we too may live a new life' (Romans 6:4). That new life has the qualities of eternal life (closeness to God, freedom from slavery to sin, freedom from fear of death) but is available here and now. Jesus' resurrection means we can have a fresh start; forgiven our past sins and a future close relationship with God. Jesus' resurrection mean that salvation isn't something that happens after death but is a state of life before death that carries on beyond death. As Jesus said, he came that those who believe in him 'may have life, and have it to the full' (John 10:10).

So this Easter as you munch your way through excessive amounts of chocolate, think about the world changing event that chocolate celebrates: Jesus' resurrection. And more importantly, think what Jesus' resurrection means to you. In Romans 10:9, Paul assures us 'if you declare with your mouth, 'Jesus is Lord', and believe in your heart that God raised him from the dead, and you will be saved.'




