#### **Books Discussed**

#### Short Stories

It was evident from the ensuing discussions that a very diverse selection of short stories had been read. It was interesting to hear what people thought and why they had enjoyed or not enjoyed them and the merits of a short story. Some people felt that reading a selection of short stories by a variety of authors was a better option than a book of short stories by the same author whilst others disagreed. We did feel that it was nice to be able to read something and complete it in a relatively short time unlike a novel although some people felt that they preferred a full length book, one they could get really engrossed in. We also thought that often the inspiration for writing the stories was more interesting than the actual story itself. It was a most lively and enlightening discussion and got the evening off to a great start.

#### Mistletoe Bride by Kate Moss

"The Mistletoe Bride and other Haunting Tales" is a collection of haunting short stories written, abridged and introduced by Kate Moss. They are all inspired by legends and folktales from the French and Sussex Countryside and each story explores the relationship between landscape and emotion, grief and guilt, loss and happiness. They are timeless in their telling, ranging from the mythical past to the present day. They exemplify the redemption experienced by the various grief stricken men and women as they come to terms with their destiny. We thought that this was a very atmospheric collection of stories being more mysterious rather than creepy creepy but, as a few people commented, the collection lacked a 'spark' and as such did not have 'wow' factor. In fact quite a few people thought that the best part of the book were the author's notes on how the stories were conceived and the origins for the inspiration to write them. Some people thought that some of the writing was tedious and that there was a definite lack of haunting to any of the stories and that it was a depressing read. As always we had a really lively discussion and scored the book from **4/10** to 9/10.

#### No Place to Hide by Susan Lewis

Fleeing her native England with her three-year-old daughter, Justine Cantrell gives herself a new name and a new life in America. In a quiet midwestern town on the shores of glittering Lake Maxinkuckee, Justine hopes to recapture the fleeting days of happiness in the long-ago summers she spent with her grandmother. And though her memories of that time are scant, Justine knows they must have shared a special bond. After all, the power of her grandmother's love has pulled her back to this haven in search of a new beginning. But fate has other plans. The more Justine gets to know the small town and its people, the more she realizes that her grandmother had her own devastating secrets, secrets that will soon threaten Justine just as surely as her own dark memories.

Yet another book which had us expressing very diverse views. Quite a number of people felt that it was a poor or even a bad copy of **We Need to Talk About Kevin** by **Lionel Shriver** whilst others thought that the story build up was good and that it was a heart wrenching and thought provoking read.

The story is run in two timelines which eventually merge and those of us who completed the book did think that this was well done. Those who did not complete the book thought that it was depressing and got more depressing the further you read. One person summed it up by saying that it was a book of misery and another said that they were hooked as they read the book and could not put it down. Once again, a book which had us having a really interesting discussion.

We scored it 1/10 to 8/10

The books for discussion are **Blindness** by **Jose Saramago** plus a book that we as individuals have enjoyed with reasons why we thought it a good read.

**Beverly Porter Circus Dogs, Retro Royals** and other deadly sins - Gallery 2 20-21 Visual Arts Centre - Church Square, Scunthorpe, North Lincolnshire DN15, UK 4th February 2017 @ 10:00 am - 22nd April 2017 @ 4:00 pm

Beverly Porter's contemporary ceramics are inspired by the history of ornaments and their display. Quirky, colourful and kitsch, the artist uses traditional techniques to explore everything from dogs to retro royal figurines Her work is hand modelled therefore each piece is entirely unique. She likes to work intuitively with the clay allowing it to dictate the shape and form of the work, gestural marks made in the clay suggest shape and movement. The pieces are dried slowly then bisque fired to 1000 degrees. She then begins to colour each piece individually with a combination of underglaze pigments and coloured slips to emphasise the surface texture. The pieces undergo a second slightly higher firing to 1100 degrees to set the pigments. She then applies a wax finish to seal.

## What is Spring?

Spring is a season. There are four seasons in a year, spring, summer, autumn and winter. Each season is marked by different weather and hours of daylight. We have seasons because the earth takes a year to move round the sun, which gives us light and warmth, and because the earth tilts at an angle of 23.5 degrees. In winter we tilt away from the sun and in the summer we tilt further towards the sun. However, on the first day of spring the sun shines equally On both the north and south hemispheres of the Earth





On the first day of spring the number of hours of daylight and night are the same, so there are 12 hours of daylight and 12 hours of darkness. This is because the sun shines directly over the equator, which is an imaginary line that divides the earth, half way in

What is Polio? Polio is a muscular crippling and potentially deadly infectious disease. It mainly attacks younger children and is caused by a polio virus. The virus is mainly spread through dirty water or by catching it from an infected person. It can cause severe paralysis of muscles within the body.

Why the colour purple? – Because it is the colour of the dye a child's finger is dipped in once they have been given the vaccine.

All the money raised will buy vaccinations for Afghanistan, Pakistan where Polio is still endemic. It will also help Nigeria where there are 10 cases of Polio where previously we thought it had been eliminated. In 1985, when Rotary began its pledge to eliminate polio when there were 125 endemic countries and now we have only the three countries left. We are so close to completely wiping it out. Rotary Clubs worldwide have been working nonstop to immunize children since 1985. It will only be the second disease that has been eradicated with smallpox being the first.

#### February / March 2017 Article



🚰 The Christian season of Lent starts on Ash Wednesday which this year falls on 1st March (for Welsh readers, St David's day is transferred this year to 28th February). Lent is a time of self-examination and repentance and is often associated with the practice of giving things up. This has recently been joined by, and increasingly replaced by, a call to take up spiritual or charitable practices. Now of course these are worthy and admirable things to do, but I suspect that our preference for 'taking up' rather than 'giving up' has less to do with our spiritual and moral health and

For over half a century now our culture has shifted away from attitudes of respect for and obedience to authority, and has moved towards an attitude of self-assertion and self-centredness. This shift is not totally a bad thing, but it is reaching its logical conclusion in the present attitude that I should be able to have what *I* want and it is wrong to deny me it. This is usually dressed up in the language of being 'free' or having a 'right' to have or do something. The progression has been from "I do what I am told" to "I do what I like as long as it doesn't hurt anyone else" to "I can do what I like whatever effect it has on others (or myself)".

more to do with our contemporary dislike of self-denial.

Jesus, by his death, has set us free the guilt of our sins. But as Paul reminds us "My friends, you were chosen to be free. So don't use your freedom as an excuse to do anything you want. Use it as an opportunity to serve each other with love" (Galatians 5:13 Contemporary English Version) and Peter says "You are free, but still you are God's servants, and you must not use your freedom as an excuse for doing wrong" (1 Peter 2:16 CEV). But in a world where 'freedom' is the battle-cry, the suggestion that we should try to live according to God's laws is not popular.

So how can we be free if we still have to live as God wants us to live? Well, we do not free a fish by taking it out of a fish tank, we only kill it. Similarly, we are only truly free if we live in the way we are intended to live, and the one who tells us what that way is is the one who created us, God. Freedom from God's rules is not freedom to live, it is only freedom to die.

The odd thing is that we know that freedom from constraint is not really freedom because we see it all around us. Unrestrained eating is unhealthy, excessive consumption of alcohol has a detrimental effect on health and society. However, the most shocking example is the 'freedom' of the sexual revolution that has led to increases in STIs, abortions, broken relationships, pornography, sexualisation of children and psychological trauma.

The promises to bring freedom and happiness cannot be fulfilled by a culture that puts personal interests above everything else. Jesus said, "I came so that everyone would have life, and have it in its fullest" (John 10:10 CEV). This Lent why not test whether Jesus' promise is true?
