





### **INGS LANE: Housing Development**

Following on from the proposed development on Station Road, a new proposal has come to light driven by ACIS (a Gainsborough based housing association) on land owned by Chappell Farms to the north side of Ings Lane. A development of 16 houses will run from the sewage pumping station to Ings House, at present arable land. The road would need to be widened & this in turn would open up the field to the south side of Ings Lane for future development. <u>Unbelievably</u> this development can only take place because it is <u>outside</u> the building line and deliberately ignores the much more suitable central sites within the village. The Main Stakeholder in a Rural Exception Site is the <u>Parish Council</u> and they have said <u>NQ</u> already to this development and credit to them for that. That should have been the end of the matter but ACIS and Chappell Farms continue to try and bulldoze this through planning. The village needs to support the Parish Council should this proceed.

The village hall consultation was  $8^{TH}$  Aug. 2018 and ACIS representatives portrayed it as "affordable housing", but not as a 100% Rural Exception site as can be seen from the literature they circulated. It later transpired it was a 100% Rural Exception Site for social housing as per Parish Council minutes of June 2017, a very different concept to the planning policy standard of 10% affordable housing.

For a Rural Exception site to be made available for building a <u>compelling plan</u> of local needs has to be clearly identified and numbers substantiated. June 2017 the demographics supporting this claim should have been produced and not just verbally.

ACIS search for land adjacent to village boundaries, as confirmed by them at the village consultation, they then approach the landowner. The Parish Council were then approached with this plan of 22, 12, and lastly 16 properties. They have made their intentions clear in their presentation to the Parish Council. Radius would be a factor in letting these properties; Radius is NOT a qualifying factor in determining residents for a rural exception site proposal as per National Planning Policy Framework-July2018 (NPPF) definition. They intimate that the Parish Council would have a vetting input into tenants for the properties; this was in place when Nookings & Dallison Road was built but it was impractical and quickly dropped. The housing association has sole responsibility for letting these properties.

It was mooted that it could be used to house the elderly, but the position of the plot is unsuitable. If there is a need for the elderly the Ward Councillors should be approached with demographics re Barnside site near the church, it is ideally situated and has outline planning permission. It is a condition of NPPF that <u>all</u> sites within the boundaries should be developed prior to approval being given outside the boundary.

The area to the west of this proposal is largely of similar build and ACIS are defeating the planning objective of mixed communities; a 10% Affordable Housing project would satisfy this aim. Many who attended the consultation did not support the proposal; to date it has been no more than a box ticking exercise as ACIS continues with site investigations. They have shown no respect to the existing community or the Parish Council.

We cannot allow housing associations to develop our village for their needs. Hibaldstow housing developments need to be carefully planned and built in an orderly manner avoiding these windfall sites. ACIS have opted to abuse recent changes in planning criteria by proposing to build a rural exception site outside the boundary purely on the basis that the land is cheap, not on village requirements. It is hoped that the Ward Councillors will support our Parish Council in not considering this site suitable for the purpose proposed.

### **NICK DAKIN, HIBALDSTOW MP**



Well what a wonderful summer we've all had! If only the quality of the politics had matched the quality of the weather! Schools return to work after record results for local students. And MPs return to Westminster. I'm determined – despite all the media distractions focused on a few big egos – to keep focused on the things that people tell me matter most to them. Health remains a major priority. Our hospital is still struggling to perform

to the standard local people deserve despite all the efforts of the front line staff. That's why I continue to work with all key partners locally to try to help them improve matters. It's good news that my campaign for getting more dentists in the Scunthorpe area has resulted increased funding for the next 3 years. Let's hope that makes it easier to get dental treatment here in Hibaldstow. Thank you to everyone that has got in touch about various possible planning developments, it's very useful for me to hear what people have to say and makes it easier for me to stand up for local people.

In fact, after so many local people around area have told me they are struggling to get access to broadband, I have been raising this issue with BT and with the Government. Being online is essential for many people's livelihoods, connecting with family and friends, and accessing key services so it's not acceptable that so many parts of our area are being overlooked with broadband infrastructure.

I've just taken over chairing one of the largest cross-party groups in parliament the All Party Group on Cancer. So back at Westminster that has been full on with meetings on blood cancer, breast cancer and less survivable cancers. I also had a meeting with Macmillan to plan the big Britain Against Cancer event in December. I met with the Health Minister about the need to up our game in outcomes for pancreatic cancer. Thanks to the fantastic work of local and national campaigners, awareness of pancreatic cancer has grown significantly over the last few years and more good research proposals are now coming forward. But there is still more to do and it is good that the Health Minister recognised that.

Finally it was great to join hundreds of young people to celebrate the work they'd done with the National Citizens' Service over the summer at a celebration held at the Baths Hall. It was inspiring to see them so inspired by what they had done!

### **HIBALDSTOW HISTORY:**

Here's a few interesting history facts from around the village! (Thanks to Wendy for providing the details!)

On  $16^{th}$  August 1911 Mr Max D.P. Dalison conveyed one rood of his land in Hibaldstow for use as a burial ground. This land lies across the road on the north side of the church. It was consecrated by the Bishop of Grimsby on  $7^{th}$  November 1953.

In 1841 the Primitive Methodist chapel, known as Ebenezer Chapel, was built on East Street in Hibaldstow. The chapel seated 200, and closed in 1946.

A Hibaldstow charity was established in 1897 when George Watson left £20 to be invested, the interest to be distributed each  $13^{th}$  July to poor widows who were over 50 years of age.

In the Village Choir Singing Competition held at Brigg in 1906, the Hibaldstow Ladies choir came 3<sup>rd</sup>.

The results were: Waddingham 69, Wrawby 67, Hibaldstow 66, Saxby 65, Winterton 60, Scotter and Scotton 57, Appleby 55 and Broughton 46.

# October 2018 Article by Reverend David Eames

A question that quite often gets asked is "Why is there so much evil in the world?" As we approach the 100th anniversary of the end of the First World War we again focus on the horror of war and "man's inhumanity to man". But there is also plenty in the news today that makes us despair about the prevalence of evil in the world.

There is, however, an irony in those who despair about the amount of evil in the world but at the same time take part in Halloween events. Because despite its 'fun' and 'playful' image, Halloween is in essence a celebration of evil. In fact it is even more dangerous because it makes evil seem to be fun and playful, and children get rewarded with sweets for being evil. This might seem a bit of a stretch make a link between dressing up as a vampire and acts of atrocity, but the normalising, minimising and rewarding of evil means that we become immune to the seriousness of evil. If the journey of a thousand miles begins with one step, this is true whether the direction is right or wrong!

Now that isn't to say that all those who dress up in Halloween costumes are evil or will commit evil acts, it is merely saying that we need to be careful what we celebrate, encourage and reward, especially in children, because that could set a precedent for future undesirable behaviour. An example of this might be those who mark Halloween as 'Mischief Night' – a time for pranks such as egging or acts of vandalism. If you can dress as a devil 'for fun' why can't you act as a devil 'for fun'? Why is one praised and the other condemned? Why is one promoted on social media and the other moaned about on that same social media?

The answer would be that it is a matter of moral boundaries, but that raises the question of where those moral boundaries should be set. Once evil in whatever form is acceptable, when does it become unacceptable? This then becomes a matter of personal interpretation: what one person calls 'being scary for fun' another might call terrorisation.

In the Christian worldview this confusion is exactly what the "spiritual forces of evil" (Ephesians 6:12) want. The prophet Isaiah warned "Woe to those who call evil good and good evil, who put darkness for light and light for darkness, who put bitter for sweet and sweet for bitter" (Isaiah 5:20). The devil is the 'father of lies' (John 8:44) who masquerades as an angel of light (2 Corinthians 11:14) – a bad thing pretending to be good. By tricking us into thinking that evil is 'just playing' and 'a bit of fun' he sows moral confusion and gets a foothold in our lives. In the baptism service, after the parents and godparents have said that they reject the devil and all rebellion against God and renounce the deceit and corruption of evil, we exhort the child to "fight valiantly as a disciple of Christ against sin, the world and the devil." But they cannot not fight this battle alone; so we ask God to deliver them from the powers of darkness, restore in them the image of his glory, and lead them in the light and obedience of Christ. Paul reminds us in Ephesians 5:8 "For you were once darkness, but now you are light in the Lord. Live as children of light."





### 'Fighting without and Fears within'

This Summer saw the Methodist Conference call together 360 people from the UK and all round the world and, my word, what a gathering it was in a Sports Hall in Nottingham.

The Methodist Church and all its many agencies (schools, colleges, homes, chaplaincies, Action for Children, All we Can, Methodist Homes, etc etc) meets annually to "confer"

It has met every year for over 270 years when John Wesley decided that he and his brother Charles must "converse"with all their helpers on "the work of God". Charles, who is reckoned to have written over 7,000 hymns in his life, was asked to write a suitable hymn to start off the event which has been sung ever since with immense vigour. The opening line is 'And are we yet alive?"

It is a sombre though exultant hymn, making it startlingly clear that the community may well have had a pretty rough and possibly dangerous time since they last met - hence "fightings without and fears within" - but nonetheless God has been blessing us mightily: "but out of all the Lord has brought us by his love"

That is a splendid way for Christians to greet each other after what may have been for some a rather upsetting and tumultuous year. We may well go through hell, but when we look back God has got us through. So Christians are not meant to be a miserable lot, even it hard pressed. We are a fundamentally a hopeful lot, a joyful people!

Back in the 1970's a Methodist Minister was asked to visit the annual conference for the little Methodist Church in Poland. It was a small body of 4,000 members and 30 ministers, yet it ran a big orphanage, some special homes, a remarkable college in Warsaw, a vital brinting press, and had enormous influence, out of all proportion to its numbers. At the time the Communist government was inefficient, cruel, ruthless and oppressive. Christians had a rough time and there was widespread poverty. But the Conference opened with everyone singing a Polish translation of that same hymn with immense energy whilst weeping copiously. It was deeply moving.

On enquiring afterwards about that hymn and the effect it had, the minister was told how, during the Second World War when Poland was occupied, their few ministers had either been forced to serve in the German army or been sent to work in armament factories. At the start of the war there were 18 active ministers. When the war was over and Conference met again there were 7 still alive. They began the conference with the traditional hymn but could only just sing it through their tears. Ever since then the hymn has had a similar effect upon them. Fightings without and fears within.

So take heart when one thinks of that hymn. It expresses with immense power the deepest Christian convictions and experience : 'out of all, the Lord has brought us with his love'. Use it as a prayer, especially if you have gone through hard times. And then end up as does the hymn: glory and praise to God. Alleluia!
